

Sunday, October 28th: The Theme - Blest Be the Tie That Binds.

Every faculty you have, your power of thinking or moving your limbs from moment to moment, is given you by God. If you devoted every moment of your whole life exclusively to His service, you could not give Him anything that was not His own already." C. S. Lewis, Mere Christianity.

After the service the deacon came over to the preacher, explained to the preacher that it was the custom of the church to give the contents of the offering plate to the visiting preacher, and handed the preacher the quarter. Looking at the quarter in his father's hand the son said, "Maybe if we had given more we would have gotten more." We have been given much. Above all, we have a loving God that has given us a "fellowship of kindred minds (that) is like to that above." We each come to worship bringing different blessings from God. We have the opportunity to share what we've been given, and that willingness to share with others is the foundation of being good stewards of His many blessings.

Let us not be like the traveling preacher, squandering his talents and giving less than he should. Let's share and be good stewards of our blessings, "our comforts and our cares" to sustain and grow God's house now and in the future.
