#### TWO SAVE THE DATES and A PEACE UPDATE

Polk Ecumenical Action Council for Empowerment – the multi--congregation justice ministry of which St. Stephens is a proud member – asks you to come to the Silver Moon Drive-In at 6:30 p.m. March 16. Silver Moon is at 1400 Old Tampa Highway, AKA Highway 92 and George Jenkins Boulevard, Lakeland.

Free admission. No movie, but a very important event.

It's the annual Nehemiah Action where elected officials and others in position of power are asked to commit to specific actions requested by PEACE. These requests are made after months of research on justice issues in Polk County.

Officials know the questions in advance, so there won't be any gotcha moments. We need your participation because it's vital to show strength in numbers.

I'll tell you what our key issues are this year, but first let me tell you where you can hear a lot more:

At the PEACE Rally at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, February 23, in the parking lot of First Presbyterian Church on Lake Hollingsworth.

Same type of format: Sitting in our cars as a safety precaution.

At First Presbyterian, you're asked to flash your lights in support instead of honking the horn so you don't upset their neighbors.

For people who can't drive to a nighttime event but want to participate:

The rally at First Presbyterian will be available via Zoom.

The Nehemiah Action – the one so vitally important to have good attendance for – will be available on Zoom and livestreamed.

As you can tell, PEACE has no intention of letting COVID-19 keep us from working toward our goals. Focus issues this year are:

Lack of affordable housing and its particular impact on homeless families, those making \$30,000 a year or less. They get left out of the picture too often when city or county officials work with developers on affordable housing.

The impact of arrests and convictions for minor offenses, misdemeanors, not violent crimes, on someone's life.

Those who follow PEACE know we've had great success in getting Lakeland Police Department, the Polk County Sheriff's Office, the State Attorney's Office, Polk Public Defender and other police departments to refer more minors in that situation to diversion/citation programs. It isn't a get-off-free pass, but it prevents them from being haunted by a criminal record.

This can be done with adults too, but it rarely is. We're working to get them included in the citation program for minor, non-violent offenses.

With affordable housing, you've probably heard the city of Lakeland is making efforts to increase supply. They don't oppose affordable housing, but there's a problem with the housing they have coming in:

Most aren't multi-bedroom units targeted to families with children making \$30,000 or less. A lot of existing funding programs, and many developers, don't focus on this group the way we need them to.

Our proposal is something done in other cities:

An affordable housing trust fund in which the city, by putting up more of its own money, has control over who the housing units are for. City officials' hands are more tied with existing federal and state programs.

You'll be hearing from PEACE members who will ask you to commit to coming to the Nehemiah Action. Please accept this request and, if you can make the one on Feb. 23 also, that would be great.
